Quantities of yarn are approximate as they are based on average requirements.				

Pair each Patons 3 1/4 mm (UK 10/USA 3) and 3 3/4 mm (UK 9/USA 5) needles.

Check actual yarn colour - as printing may not match yarn exactly.

Jacket: Patons 3 ^{1/4} mm (UK 10/USA 3) circular needle (length 60 cm). 10 buttons.

Hat with Ear Flaps: 1 button.

Tension

22 sts and 42 rows to 10 cm (patt) on 3 ^{3/4} mm needles or size needed to achieve stated tension.

It is important to check your tension before starting your garment. If there are too many stitches to 10 cm, your tension is tight and you should change to a larger size needle. If there are too few, your tension is loose and you should change to a smaller size needle.

Caution

It is essential to work to the stated


tension, and we cannot accept responsibility for the finished product if any yarn other than the specified yarn is used.

Abbreviations

K=knit; P=purl; st=stitch; stocking st=1 row K, 1 row P; garter st=every row K; tog=together; tbl=through back of loops; inc=increase by working into front and back of st; dec=decrease by working 2 sts together; **beg**=beginning; **alt**= alternate; rep=repeat; cont=continue; meas=measures; **foll**=following: rem=remain(ing); RS=right side; **WS**=wrong side; **cm**=centimetres; in=inches: mm=millimetres: sL1K= slip 1 knitways; yfwd=yarn forward; psso=pass slip st over; patt=pattern; 0=no st, row or time to be worked in this size; M1=make a st by picking up horizontal loop lying before next st and working into back of it.

Buttons: Stitchpoint

K1bw=K1 below, K into next st 1 row below, at the same time slipping off st above (see diagram).



U.S.A. Glossary

Cast off=bind off; tension=gauge; knit up=pick up and knit; stocking st=stockinette st; yarn forward, yarn over needle or yarn round needle=yarn over.

Instructions are given for the first size, with larger size(s) given in square brackets []. Where only one figure is given this applies to both (all) sizes.

Before starting to knit, read the instructions carefully and circle all figures relating to your size with a coloured pencil.

JACKET

LEFT FRONT AND RIGHT FRONT (alike)

With 3 $\frac{1}{4}$ mm needles, cast on 17 [19, 21, 23] sts.

Rib row 1 - (RS), K2, *P1, K1; rep from * to last st, K1.

Rib row 2 - K1, *P1, K1; rep from * to end.

Rep these 2 rows for 4 cm, ending with row 2.

**Change to 3 ^{3/4} mm needles and patt thus:

Row 1 - (RS), K.

Row 2 - K1, *P1, K1bw; rep from * to last 2 sts, P1, K1.

These 2 rows form patt.

Cont in patt until work meas 22 [25, 30, 34] cm, ending with RS facing. Cast off.

BACK

With 3 ^{1/4} mm needles, cast on 51 [**57**, 63, **69**] sts and work in rib as on Fronts for 4 cm, ending with row 2.

Work as Fronts from ** to end.

Place a marker in 18th [20th, 22nd, 24th] st from each side edge to mark shoulders.

SLEEVES

With 3 ¹/₄ mm needles, cast on 29 [**33**, 35, **37**] sts and work in rib as on Fronts for 3 cm, ending with row 2.

Change to 3 ^{3/4} mm needles and patt as on Fronts, shaping sides by inc 1 st at each end of 3rd [3rd, 5th, 5th] and every foll alt [alt, 4th, 4th] row until there are 47 [41, 55, 45] sts, then on every foll 4th [4th, 6th, 6th] row until there are 53 [57, 61, 67] sts, taking inc sts into patt.

Work straight until Sleeve meas 13 [16, 20, 26] cm, ending with RS facing. Cast off loosely.

MAKE UP

Do not press.

Join shoulder seams. Place centre of cast-off edge of sleeves to shoulder seams, then sew Sleeves to Fronts and Back. Join side and sleeve seams.

Front Border and Collar

With RS facing and 3 ½ mm circular needle, starting at lower edge of Right Front, **knit up** 12 sts to top of rib, 54 [63, 78, 90] sts to shoulder seam, 21 [21, 27, 27] sts across back neck, 54 [63, 78, 90] sts down left front to top of rib, then 12 sts to lower edge (153 [171, 207, 231] sts).

Starting with row 2, work in rib as on Fronts for 6 rows for Boy's version /5 rows for Girl's version, thus ending with WS/RS facing for next row.

**Next row - (Buttonhole row), rib 3, *cast off 2, rib 10 [12, 14, 16] (including st on needle after cast-off); rep from *

twice more, cast off 2, rib to end.

Next row - In rib, casting on 2 over those cast off.**

Work in rib for 10 [10, 16, 16] rows, thus ending with WS facing for Boy's version /RS facing for Girl's version for next row.

Work from ** to ** once more (8 buttonholes made).

Work in rib for 5 rows for Boy's version/6 rows for Girl's version, thus ending with RS facing. Cast off in rib.

Back Tab

With 3 ^{1/4} mm needles, cast on 9 sts and work in rib as on Fronts for 8 cm, ending with row 2. Cast off in rib.

Sew Back Tab in place to Back of Jacket as in photograph.

Sew on buttons to Border and Back Tab.

Do not dry handknits in harsh sunlight as fading or yellowing may occur.

HAT WITH EAR FLAPS

With 3 1/4 mm needles, cast on 99 [111] sts.

Rib row 1 - (RS of rib, WS of Hat), K1, *P1, K1; rep from * to end.

Rib row 2 - P1, *K1, P1; rep from * to end.

Rep these 2 rows for 10 cm, ending with row 1 and RS of Hat facing for next row.

Change to 3 3/4 mm needles and patt as on Fronts of Jacket for 4 [5] cm, ending with WS facing for next row.

Shape top

Decrease row - Patt 10, *K3tog, P1, sL1K, K2tog, psso, patt 17 [21]; rep from * twice more, K3tog, P1, sL1K, K2tog, psso, patt 10 (83 [95] sts).

Work 3 rows.

Decrease row - Patt 8, *K3tog, P1, sL1K, K2tog, psso, patt 13 [17]; rep

from * twice more, K3tog, P1, sL1K, K2tog, psso, patt 8 (67 [79] sts).

Cont dec in this way on every foll 4th row, working 2 sts less at beg and end and 4 sts less between decs on each decrease row until 19 [15] sts rem. Work 2 rows, thus ending with RS facing for next row.

Break yarn, thread through rem sts, draw up tightly and fasten off securely.

MAKE UP

Do not press.

Join back seam, reversing seam for turn-back.

Stalk

With 3 1 /4 mm needles, cast on 7 sts. K 1 row, then cast off knitways. Fold Stalk in half and sew to top of Hat.

Fold rib back as in photograph.

Ear Flaps

With 3 ^{1/4} mm needles, cast on 17 [21] sts and work in rib as on Fronts of Jacket for 12 [14] rows, thus ending with RS facing for next row.

Next row - K1, sL1K, K2tog, psso, rib to last 4 sts, K3tog, K1.

Next row - Rib to end.

Rep last 2 rows until 9 sts rem, thus ending with RS facing for next row.

Next row - K1, sL1K, K1, psso, rib 3, K2tog, K1 (7 sts).

Work 1 row, thus ending with RS facing for next row.

Left Ear Flap: Cast off in rib.

Right Ear Flap: Do **not** break yarn. Slip rem 7 sts on a safety-pin.

Sew Ear Flaps in position to lower edge of Hat as in photograph.

Chin Strap

With RS facing and 3 ½ mm needles, cont in rib on sts from safety-pin, until Chin Strap fits comfortably under chin to Left Ear Flap, ending with RS facing for next row.

Next row - (Buttonhole row), rib 3, yfwd, K2tog, rib 2.

Work in rib for a further 3 rows, thus

ending with RS facing. Cast off in rib.

Sew on button to Left Ear Flap.

Do not dry handknits in harsh sunlight as fading or yellowing may occur.

PULL-ON HAT

Work as Hat with Ear Flaps, omitting Ear Flaps and Chin Strap.

MITTS

With 3 1/4 mm needles, cast on 31 [35] sts and work in rib as on Fronts of Jacket for 12 rows, thus ending with RS facing for next row.

Change to 3 3/4 mm needles and patt as on Fronts of Jacket until Mitt meas

10 [11] cm, ending with RS facing for next row.

Next row - K1, *K3tog; rep from * to last 0 [1] st, K0 [1] (11 [13] sts).

Break yarn, thread through rem sts, draw up tightly and fasten off securely.

MAKE UP

Do not press.


Join seam.

Using 2 strands of yarn approx 85 cm long, make a twisted cord and sew one end to each Mitt.

Instructions for making a simple yarn cord:

Get a friend to help and measure off required lengths of yarn. Knot ends together, insert pencil at each end in front of knot between lengths of yarn (A). Facing each other and holding yarn together between thumb and finger in front of knot, turn pencil clockwise (B). Continue until strands

are tightly twisted, then bring pencils



together and allow cord to twist (C). Remove pencils and knot ends.
